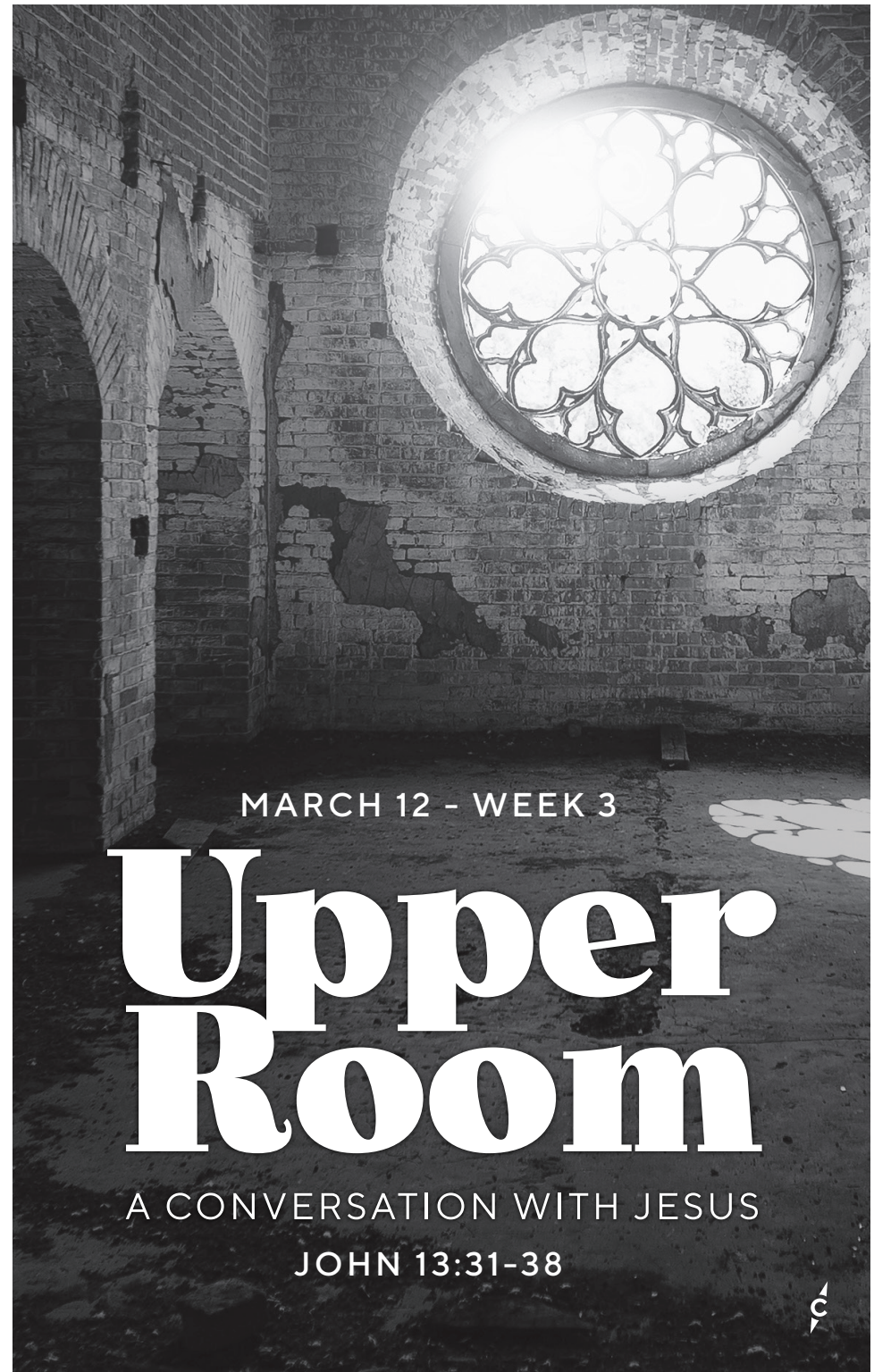

A CONVERSATION WITH JESUS

JOHN 13:31-38



CONNECT (BUILD RELATIONSHIPS)

1. If you could define the word “glory” from a cultural standpoint, how would you define it?
2. Has someone important in your life ever left or moved on and you felt left behind? Explain.
3. If you had to leave on a trip and would be away from loved ones for a long time, what might be a few last words you would leave with them?

THRIVE (EXPLORE BIBLICAL TRUTH)

Read John 13:31-38 and reflect on the following questions.

4. Why do you think Jesus shifted the conversation here immediately after revealing his betrayal?
5. What is the connection between Jesus’ glory and God’s glory in verse 31?
6. Go back to John 1:14 and draw some connections with verse 31.

7. What emotions might the disciples have been feeling as Jesus spoke the words in verse 33?
8. How might the context of what was happening right now make Jesus’ command to love one another seem like a “new command” in verse 34?
9. Why do you think Jesus needed to rebuke Peter in verses 37-38?

COMMIT (BE ON MISSION)

10. How, like Jesus, can God be “glorified” through us?
11. Jesus tells us we must love one another “as I have loved you.” Describe how that love manifests itself, and why this will be the way the world knows we are his disciples.
12. What lessons can we take from Peter’s response to Jesus and the Lord’s response back to him in our daily lives?

PAUSE, PONDER & PRAY

“A new command I give you: Love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another. By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another.” JOHN 13:34-35
